Sonrisas Dental Health continues to thrive, increasing our reach and our services to patients and the community, despite the challenges of the ongoing pandemic. This is a testament to not just our wonderful staff and supporters but also the seemingly infinite demand for affordable dental care in San Mateo County. This year we are providing over 14,000 clinic visits for almost 5,000 children and adults, as well as dental screenings and oral health education for 2,000 students at low-income schools in San Mateo County.

We have a vision: that every adult and child in San Mateo County has a dental home, including those with physical, developmental, or economic challenges. Dr. Sará King, a social justice leader, said "If you have a body, you deserve

A Great Year

Sonrisas provided 13,838 dental visits in FY21-22, an increase of 30% over previous years. 72% of visits serve low-income patients

Emergency treatment on the rise The pandemic has greatly impacted children's oral health, particularly among low-income children. Up to 20% of children at some screenings during the 2021-2022 school year needed urgent or emergency treatment due to pain, infection, or extensive decay, compared to 6-10% pre-pandemic.

Community Care Coordination Sonrisas' Community Care Coordinator calls each child's family to share screening findings, provide oral health education, and schedule or refer children with urgent or emergency concerns who do not have a dentist.

School Partnerships Sonrisas partners with school districts throughout San Mateo County to provide dental screenings to students at low-income schools. I Constant Service of the service of

Strategic Plan Sonrisas established a 3-year strategic plan with three key focus areas to guide our work to expand access to dental care in San Mateo County.

Sonrisas speaks smiles Many patients speak Spanish or Cantonese at home, as well as Tagalog, Vietnamese, or Korean. Most Sonrisas staff are bilingual and bicultural, having grown up in the communities we serve. We also provide interpreters when needed.

Half Moon Bay Remodel

coastside refresh Sonrisas' Half Moon Bay Center underwent a refresh in early 2022. New flooring, and ceiling tiles were installed, the clinic was painted throughout, cabinets were repaired or replaced, and a generous donation of dental chairs allowed us to replace the two remaining original dental chairs, which were donated to Sonrisas (used!) in 2001.

Local artists Susan Verlander and Mark Verlander of Verlander Design donated a mural depicting coastside love to the updated center.









Dr. Torrey Rothstein, DDS Dental Director

Dr. Torrey has been part of the Sonrisas Dental Health team since 2006. As Dental Director, he oversees all aspects of patient care, as well as clinic services and programs. Dr. Torrey's passion for providing high-quality care for low-income patients, with dignity and respect, is a hallmark of Sonrisas' approach.

Dr. Travis Wu, DDS, General Dentist

Dr. Wu trained at the University of the Pacific, Arthur A Dugoni School of Dentistry in San Francisco. Providing high quality, individualized dental care for low- income patients, helping them return to oral health as quickly as possible, is what makes Dr. Wu proud to be a part of the Sonrisas team.

Dr. Judyth Lee, DMD Pediatric Specialist Dentist

Dr. Lee, a pediatric specialist dentist, trained at Tufts University School of Dental Medicine and NYU Lutheran Medical Center.

Dr. Lee was drawn to Sonrisas' innovative non-profit dental center model with its collaborative approach that gives her patients and their families the time and support they need to learn about oral hygiene, allowing them to help their children take care of their teeth at home. Many Sonrisas patients' parents did not grow up going to the dentist, and many do not know the importance of bringing their children to the dentist for preventative care.

Once Dr. Lee has completed initial treatment for a new patient, she and her team shift to educating families about preventative oral health practices. Parents often have questions about the role of baby teeth, which hold spaces for permanent teeth, support healthy bone growth, and are essential for healthy eating.

start young Getting started with a dental home at an early age sets up children for a lifetime of better oral and overall health. Our pediatric dental program provides care and education specially designed for the youngest children and their parents.

Dr. Brian Lee, DDS, General Dentist

Dr. Brian joined Sonrisas Dental Health as a dental resident in advanced education in general dentistry through our partnership with NYU Langone School of Dentistry. He treats patients in our dental centers as well as our clinic in Pescadero seeing farmworker patients in partnership with Puente de la Costa Sur.

With no family or contacts in San Mateo County when they arrived, they bravely built a new life from scratch. Dental care was hard for them to afford with limited income, but Thu and her daughter became patients at Sonrisas.

They were impressed by the care they received and how they were treated. Thu's hygienist at Sonrisas encouraged her to apply for a job at Sonrisas, and she joined the team, which has opened many opportunities for her.




Oral health education

reaching out to schools

Led by Dr. Bonnie Jue, D.D.S., Sonrisas' Director of Community Engagement, our school-based Oral Health Screening and Education Program serves students at low-income schools throughout San Mateo County – an anticipated 2,000 students during FY22-23. Priority schools, where the majority of students are low-income, are the focus of the program. We are partnering with one district to create pathways to serve children who are newcomers or experiencing homelessness.

At screening events, a Sonrisas dental provider completes oral health assessments and students attend an oral health education session. Afterward, our Community Care Coordinator contacts parents and guardians to share their children's oral health status, provides education, and helps them connect to a dentist if they do not already have one.



Access to Care Program serving low-income patients

Sonrisas' Access to Care (ATC) program provides care to low-income patients who have public insurance or who utilize our affordable sliding scale if they are uninsured. Our care model prioritizes continuity of care and a private-practice experience regardless of income.


Financial Overview



Fiscal Year 2021-2022

Operating Budget \$4,628,818

Public dental insurance covers 50% of the cost of providing care and does not cover community screenings. Sonrisas must fundraise \$2M annually to care for our patients and find others in the community who do not yet have access to dental care.
